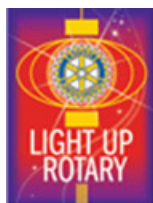

MINUTES FROM MAY 2015 BOARD OF DIRECTORS MEETING

- A. Board Changes Ras, Wilson, and Barry rolling off. Justin, Tommy, and Barney Barnhardt rolling on. Jon Lowder coming on as Secretary. Will need a “past president”?
- B. Committees –
 - a. Membership We’re up three but in last gold club cycle only one member (Lisa) sponsored any new members. The year before it was heavily supported by Sam Hummel. This isn’t a sustainable model.
 - b. Ambassadors of fun Mitzi and Ashby
 - c. Foundation/Triple Crown Are we going to focus on bringing this back?
 - d. Treasurer’s report Senior Active - We have 11 members who are rule of 85 eligible who haven’t asked for it. Our average Senior attendance is 54%, this would mean we would lose \$424 per member in meal dues or \$4664/year.
 - e. Rotary Conference Abby will go to Brazil instead of Rich and instead of going in her year (S Korea).
 - f. Social Has been bumped up to \$5k. Planning only 44 regular meetings.
